

- Knowing God is Based on Divine Revelation
- Matthew 11:27: "No one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and anyone to whom the Son chooses to reveal him."

- Knowing God:

 - **Hosea 6:6:** "For I delight in loyalty rather than sacrifice, And in the knowledge of God rather than burnt offerings."

- Knowing God:
 - Is Why Jesus Came
 - 1 John 5:20: "we know that the Son of God has come, and has given us understanding so that we may know Him who is true."

- Knowing God:
 - The meaning of eternal life:
 - **John 17:3:** "And this is eternal life, that they know you the only true God and Jesus Christ whom you have sent."

- Why can't we comprehend God fully?
 - 1. God is One of a kind, foreign, and unique
 - **Tozer:** "The child, the philosopher, and the religionist have all one question: 'What is God like?' God is not like anything; that is, He is not exactly like anything or anybody."
 - **Isaiah 46:9:** "For I am God, and there is no other; *I* am God, and there is no one like Me."

• **Ezekiel 1:4***ff*: "As I looked, behold a storm wind was coming from the north, a great cloud with fire flashing forth continually and a bright light around it, and in its midst something *like* glowing metal...within it there were figures *resembling* four living beings. In the midst of the living beings there was something that looked *like* burning coals of fire, *like* torches darting back and forth among the living beings. Now over the heads of the living beings there was something *like* an expanse, *like* the awesome gleam of crystal...

• Ezekiel 1:26ff: "Now above the expanse that was over their heads there was something resembling a throne and on that which resembled a throne, high up, was a figure with the appearance of a man. From the appearance of His loins and upward something like glowing metal that looked like fire all around within it...such was the appearance of the likeness of the glory of the Lord."

"Strange as this language is, it still does not create the impression of unreality. One gather that the whole scene is very real but entirely alien to anything men know on earth. So in order to convey what he sees, the prophet must employ such words as 'likeness,' 'appearance,' 'as it were,' and the 'likeness of the appearance.'"

Hegel/Speculative School/Ancient Philosophy

- The PERPETUAL NOVELTY:
 - In heaven, we are still finite, God is still infinite
 - For all eternity, we will be learning more about God
 - Heaven will be perpetually new

"Heaven will be a never-ending, ever-increasing discovery of more and more of God's glory with greater and ever-greater joy in Him. If God's glory and our joy in Him are one, and yet we are not infinite as He is, then our union with Him in the all-satisfying experience of His glory can never be complete, but must be increasing with intimacy and intensity forever and ever. The perfection of heaven is not static. Nor do we see at once all there is to see—for that would be a limit on God's glorious self-revelation. Yet we do not become God. Therefore, there will always be more, and the end of increased pleasure in God will never come."




Essential Attributes

The Attributes of God

1689 London Baptist Confession: Chapter 2, Paragraph 1: "The Lord our God is but one only living and true God; whose subsistence is in and of himself, infinite in being and perfection; whose essence cannot be comprehended by any but himself; a most pure spirit, invisible, without body, parts, or passions, who only hath immortality, dwelling in the light which no man can approach unto; who is immutable, immense, eternal, incomprehensible, almighty, every way infinite, most holy, most wise, most free, most absolute; working all things according to the counsel of his own immutable and most righteous will for his own glory; most loving, gracious, merciful, long-suffering, abundant in goodness and truth, forgiving iniquity, transgression, and sin; the rewarder of them that diligently seek him, and withal most just and terrible in his judgments, hating all sin, and who will by no means clear the guilty."

Classifying the Divine Attributes

- No perfect way to classify, but many different ways:
 - Lutheran: Positive vs. Negative
 - Arminian: Absolute vs. Relative
 - Erickson (Baptist), McClain: Greatness vs. Goodness
 - Roman Catholic: Being vs. Activity
 - Frame: Goodness vs. Knowledge vs. Power
 - Historic Reformed: Incommunicable vs. Communicable (Berkhof, Bavinck, Shedd, Grudem, Culver)

Classifying the Divine Attributes


- Incommunicable Attributes are attributes which God does not share or communicate to others, such as human beings, i.e.
 - God's Independence (Aseity)
 - God's Eternity,
 - God's Immutability,
 - God's Omnipresence

Classifying the Divine Attributes

- Communicable Attributes, those attributes which God shares or communicates with us, i.e.
 - God's love,
 - God's kindness,
 - God's wrath

God is NOT a collection of attributes added together

God's attributes are NOT additions to Himself



The Unity of God's Attributes

"There is no suggestion that part of God is light and part of God is love, or that God is partly light and partly love. It should be clear that each attribute is simply a way of describing one aspect of God's total character or being. God himself is a *unity*, a unified and completely integrated whole person who is infinitely perfect in *all* of these attributes."




